Hello! My name is Ms. Melanie Guest. I have been teaching in various environments for over 20 years! That is right, I started when I was only 5, pretty impressive, ya?

The first teaching assignment I took was at an international secondary school in Kampala, Uganda. While I was there I helped organize a physical education program for all the East African international schools run by the Aga Khan. I loved the opportunity to work with local teachers to create programs that utilized minimal or flexible equipment, providing students in grades 7 to 12 with great body awareness and physical literacy skills. While there, I was also part of organizing and implementing two educational field trips for students aged 12-19 to learn about mountain



environments. One trip took students from my school in Uganda to Mount Elgon, and another trip for students at a sister school in Tanzania to climb Mount Kilimanjaro. It was a wild ride and a great learning opportunity not only for the students' growth, but also me to see what is possible with some creativity!

I have guided and taught in various environments and at multiple schools through my career as an educator. Some of the other highlights were working to develop the WILD program in Cochrane, helping develop and implement the first years of outdoor CALM at the Outdoor Learning Center in the Bow Valley, before finding my way to the Third Schools Family over 5 years ago to bring the first LYNX class from concept to reality in Canmore in 2020!

I love the outdoors for recreation and as a learning environment and believe in the use of nature as a teacher. Unfortunately, this same love of the outdoors took me out of it when I was injured at the end of the 2021-22 school year. 
